<p>A bee pollinating a flower. This will turn into a fruit!</p>	<p>A seed that could be carried by the wind.</p>	<p>Peeling bark (see a river birch, London planetree)</p>	<p>A snag (a standing, dead tree)</p>
<p>Smooth bark</p>	<p>Berry-like fruit. Birds and small mammals love these!</p>	<p>Roots that grow above the ground. Don't trip! (see a beech, bald cypress)</p>	<p>Poison ivy growing on a tree. This is an important food source for deer.</p>
<p>A sapling</p>	<p>Two trees competing for resources</p>	<p> TREE SPACE</p>	<p>Rotting log</p>
<p>English ivy growing on a tree. This hurts the tree!</p>	<p>Mature/ adult tree</p>	<p>Oak acorns. How big are they? Can you find acorns from different oaks?</p>	<p>A bird's nest</p>
