







Our Impact by the Numbers

Financials

This report covers Casey Trees' fiscal year 2025 (July 2024 - June 2025). Our annual audit is typically completed by December.


In fiscal year 2025, Casey Trees generated \$10.3 million in total revenue. Our financial endowment covered 47% of expenses, with the remainder funded through grants, individual and corporate donor contributions, contracts, fee-forservice work, and tree sales. Every dollar plants more trees, educates residents, strengthens policy, and protects green space permanently — prioritizing communities in our region with the least tree canopy and greatest environmental need.



TREE CARE & PROTECTION

Partnered with Chesapeake Climate Action Network to hold over 30 invasive vine removal events, engaging hundreds of volunteers and saving over 1,500 trees.



CONSERVATION

Protected over 500 trees on 10 conservation sites across DC and MD as an accredited land trust.



VOLUNTEERS

Engaged with over 4,000 volunteers at tree planting events, tree care events, and youth programs throughout DC and the greater capital region.

STUDENTS

Educated over 1,000 students at over 25 DC schools, and provided countless out-of-school and camp experiences throughout the year.



CASEY TREE FARM

Harvested and sent over 9,500 trees to DC and other jurisdictions including Baltimore, MD; Fairfax, VA; Richmond, VA; Charleston, WV; and many cities and counties across the region to help communities meet their tree planting goals.
